# **The Law and Your Business**

### The Law and Your Business – Florida Appellate Court Finds that The Ten-Year Statute of Repose Does Not Apply to Structural Engineer/Inspector of New Residence

In *Manney v MBV Engineering, Inc,* a homeowner hired a professional engineer to review the construction drawings and to inspect a house that had been recently constructed to determine if there were any structural defects prior to the homeowner purchasing the home. The engineer advised the homeowner that the structural integrity of the house was excellent and that there were no signs of structural distress. Thirteen years after purchasing the house and after consulting with another licensed structural engineer, the homeowner discovered that the house had significant latent structural defects including a design defect in the foundation. The homeowner then filed a lawsuit against the engineer for negligence.

The engineer argued that the homeowner's negligence claim was time barred because it was filed more than ten years after the statute of repose in Fla. Stat. Section 95.11(3)(c) had run. The trial court agreed and found that the work by the engineer fell within the ten-year statute of repose because the work related to the planning, design, and construction of a structure. The appellate court, however, disagreed and stated that in order for the statute of repose to apply the action must be "founded on" the design, planning, or construction of an improvement. The terms "founded on" mean based upon, arising from, growing out of, or resting upon. Further, the appellate court found that the crux of the complaint was that the engineer negligently performed an inspection of a completed structure. As a result, the engineer did not design, plan, or construct an improvement to real property. Thus, the appellate court found that the statute of repose did not apply and the homeowner was allowed to proceed with its negligence claim against the engineer for inspection work performed by the engineer over thirteen years ago.

# SAFETY NEWS

### Safety Awareness in the Home

We work very hard to educate our employees in how to perform their daily tasks safely. We provide them with personal protective equipment, the right tools, monitor the working environment for hazards and, correct unsafe behavior and conditions. The workplace can be one of the safest places for workers to be but what about when our employees leave the safety of the workplace and get in their cars or trucks to go home? What about when they get home? Do they relay that same message to the home environment and the loved ones there? Unfortunately, national statistics show that accidents are the leading cause of fatalities from the age of 1 to 45 and those fatal accidents are 32 times more likely to occur away from work. The leading cause of death in children from 1-4 is drowning and it's the sixth leading cause of all fatalities. How many of us have boats and love to be on the water with our families? We are surrounded by water. Ponds streams rivers lakes and oceans. How many of us take the time to teach water safety? If your job was to work over around or in water, I guarantee you will have had some training in water hazards.

The point is we are more likely to sustain and injury or experience a fatality off the job than on the job. The bureau of labor statistics says that 97% of all injuries and fatalities occur off the job. That's an amazing statistic. What's even more amazing is that almost all of these events are the result of people ignoring safe practices, ignorance of safe procedures or lack of training or willing or blatant violations of safe behavior. Unfortunately, many of these are learned through observations of behavior and some unsafe behavior is actually taught. Another statistic is that children learn by watching. Children can be taught safe behavior but seldom are. Swim lessons, life jackets, home chores, lawn mowing, maintenance issues, ladders, chemicals, animals and

making good decisions are all learned behavior. All these things and more can be taught but seldom are. If we can get our employees to internalize the safety message we work so hard to give them, if they can relate their training to the need to create that same safe environment at home, we have succeeded and made their homes and families safer.

Safety isn't only for the jobsite. It's for our families and our homes too.
