The Law and Your Business– 2020 Constitutional Amendments By Tony Zebouni, Lindell, Farson & Zebouni

November 3, 2020 is election day. In addition to candidates there are six (6) proposed constitutional amendments for your consideration. In Florida a constitutional amendment can get on the ballot by ether proposal by the Florida legislature of by voter ballot Initiative. This article will provide you some information regarding each proposed amendment that requires a 60% yes vote to be approved. I am providing a brief summary for your consideration.

Amendment 1: Voting Rights. The amendment would slightly alter the wording of the state constitution to say that "only a citizen" of the United States can vote. Currently in Florida it states that only American citizens may vote. The amendment would simply change the wording that currently says that "every citizen" can vote. The League of Women Voters is opposed to this amendment.

Amendment 2. Minimum Wage Increase. The amendment would gradually raise the minimum wage in Florida to \$15 per hour by 2026. Florida's current minimum wage is \$8.56 per hour, greater than the \$7.25 federal minimum wage. The Florida Chamber of Commerce is opposed to this amendment. The League of Women Voters supports this amendment.

Amendment 3. Open Voting in Primary Elections. This amendment would permit all registered voters, regardless of party affiliation to vote in a primary for governor, state Legislature and Cabinet-level races. The two highest vote-getters, regardless of party, would advance to the general election. This system is often known as a "jungle primary." It could potentially mean that two Democrats or two Republicans face each other in the general election. The League of Women Voters is opposed to this amendment. The Florida Chamber of Commerce is opposed to this amendment

Amendment 4. Constitutional Amendment. Currently the constitution can be amended if 60% of the voters approve the measure. This amendment would make it harder for voter ballot initiatives to change the constitution. Instead of a single referendum requiring the approval of 60 percent of voters, this amendment require approval in two separate elections. The League of Women Voters is opposed to this amendment. The Florida Chamber of Commerce supports this amendment.

Amendment 5. Limitation on Homestead Assessments. Floridians who move from one homesteaded property to another have two years from Jan. 1 of the year of the sale of the first home to claim the tax benefit. This would give homeowners an additional year to do so. The League of Women Voters is opposed to this amendment.

Amendment 6. Tax Benefit to Spouses of Deceased Veterans. Currently, some Florida veterans get a discount on their property taxes if they were honorably discharged, are over 65 and have been permanently disabled by combat. This amendment would allow spouses to continue to claim that property tax exemption after the veteran's death if the spouse holds the title to the property and permanently lives there. It would also allow the spouse to transfer the exemption to a new property in some cases. The League of Women Voters is opposed to this amendment.

NUCA Urges One-Year Extension of FAST Act

Facing an expiration of the nation's surface transportation law on Sept. 30, NUCA and 88 other organizations sent an urgent letter to Congress on Sept. 9 asking for at least a one-year extension of the FAST Act. Our association also asked for emergency federal funding of state DOTs, who have already delayed or cancelled \$8 billion in projects due to revenue declines this year. Read the letter <u>here</u>.

OSHA To Narrow Its 2017 Beryllium Rule

Two construction associations reached in late August a settlement with OSHA to narrow the scope of the agency's January 2017 beryllium final rule. NUCA and others have been concerned that the rule was written too broadly for a risk deemed to be minimal on construction sites. As part of the settlement in the U.S. Eighth District Court, OSHA will issue a new FAQ guidance making clear that for normal construction operations exposures to common materials will for the most part not be covered by this rule. The Trump Administration is expected to issue a new beryllium rulemaking this year. Read more here.
