

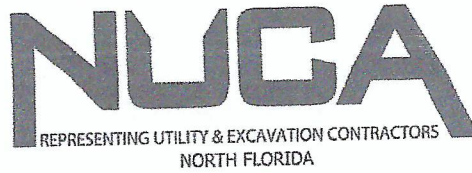

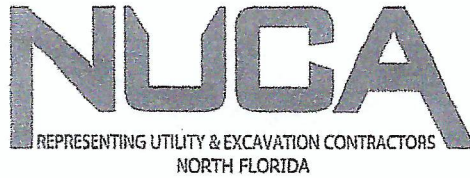

Dancing has been a huge part of my life since I was very young. I was fortunate enough to attend art schools for both middle and high school. Dance is not an easy activity. There are moves that seem impossible for the human body, yet they can be achieved. Failing new moves is a part of learning how to dance. Failing auditions and not getting a part is also a huge aspect. Learning new dance moves is always a challenge; some I was able to stick, and others I still can't do to this day. The frustration of not being able to do something on the first try is very difficult to get over. I had to learn to be patient with myself, along with understanding that some things will take time. For the moves I couldn't ever stick, I was much harder on myself in the beginning. I came to understand that one person can't do everything. The other failures I learned from were auditions. Choreographers are very picky in who they chose and sometimes they won't pick you just because of your hair color. Everything must fit the image that they have in their head. Through the constant rejections at auditions I learned that not every dance was for me. Yes, it was hard to be rejected, but those rejections led me to other pieces that I absolutely loved. I have learned to take rejection, fix the mistakes I made, and move forward to better opportunities.
