Failure is an important lesson for everyone to learn. It helps to build character and better appreciate when things go right. A failure I think back on is when I was at a youth camp, the summer of 6th grade. Each year there is a new adventure rec game that must be completed by the end of the week. The assigned group must work together as a team to accomplish it. This particular year we had an especially hard game called pipeline. You had to transport different size balls, such as marbles and golf balls, from one person to the next using different size and cut PVC pipes. We had to accomplish this without being able to touch the ball with your hands and obstacles littering the ground.

At the beginning of the week, before you attempt the game, the counselors have you set a number of times you can fail before there is a punishment. As a group, we chose 10 failures and after we had failed 10 times, we then had to complete arm circles for as long as the counselor saw fit. As the week went on the arms circles would get longer and longer. Each time somebody would fail, the group would get more and more frustrated with each other and especially with the person who had caused the failure. This game had been attempted the previous year by the older students in the group, with no success. They were very eager to be finished with this game. It seemed like a simple concept but when trying to get 15 middle schoolers to work together; it becomes almost impossible. We did not complete the game that year and had to start again the next year.

What made this failure so hard is that by the end of the week we only had to get one more marble across the line of pipes and then we would have successfully completed the game.

Unfortunately on the last person, right before it went to the ending mark it was dropped. It would

be easy to blame that one specific person who drops the marble causing the failure for the entire group. We had to remember that throughout the entire week we had all at one point or another, been the one responsible for dropping ball. It can be easy to blame another person or a situation when you fail at something, but sometimes failure is necessary to learn the bigger lesson.

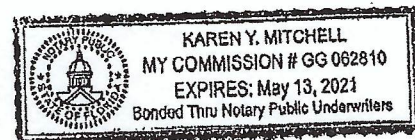
