## The Law and Your Business

### The Law and Your Business – Stop Work Orders and Delay Damages Christian Lake, Esq., Lindell Farson & Zebouni

During the course of construction work, unexpected issues can arise that can grind work to a halt and result in a stop work order. In addition to the inconvenience of demobilization and delays, stop work orders often create additional costs relating to things such as demobilizing, and then remobilizing, workers, increased cost or unavailability of materials in today's world of supply chain issues, and potential additional monthly insurance premiums for prolonged delays. With that in mind, it is important to know your rights when a stop work order is issued.

Recently, in *Sarasota County v. S. Underground Indus., Inc.*, a Florida Court dealt with a case involving a stop work order issued by Sarasota County to a contractor installing piping underneath the intracoastal waterway. In that case, a nearby homeowner complained that the vibrations from the drilling associated with the pipe installation had damaged his home. The County immediately issued a stop work order under a provision of the contract that allowed the County to do so to correct safety issues. Southern Underground Industries, Inc. ("SUI") then retained an engineer to inspect the damage to the home. The engineer determined that the damage was merely cosmetic and that monitoring the vibrations would prevent future damage.

SUI had an insurance policy to cover any homeowners' claims related to its drilling and also offered to fix the cosmetic damage to subject home by paying a contractor selected by the homeowner. The homeowner rejected SUI's offer and filed a claim on SUI's policy after being denied a warranty from the County. Despite the existence of insurance adequate to compensate the homeowner for any damage relating to the pipe installation and a determination from an engineer that the drilling caused only cosmetic damage and that there were no safety concerns with continuing drilling, the County kept the stop work order in place for 71 additional days as it tried to appease the homeowner.

SUI then requested compensation from the County for the increased expenses it incurred due to the stop work order. SUI based this request on a clause within the contract which allowed SUI to request and increase in the contract price if where the County suspends work under the contract. The County denied that request and SUI filed suit.

The Court awarded SUI damages under the contract in the amount of the increase in contract price attributable to County-imposed delays. The County tried to set off those damages by arguing it was entitled to liquidated damages under the contract since the County did not issue a final acceptance of SUI's work until over two years after the contractual completion date. The Court rejected the County's argument for liquidated damages since that delay in final acceptance was caused by the homeowner's lingering claim for damages relating to the drilling and the County had possession and use of the installed pipes before the contractual completion date.

NUCA's Position on Employer Mandate Wins: OSHA Vax Mandate Struck Down By U.S. Supreme Court On January 13, the U.S. Supreme Court blocked the Biden Administration's OSHA Emergency Temporary Standard vaccine-or-test mandate for large employers with more than 100 employees, preventing implementation of a policy which would have forced many employers to either mandate vaccination or face large fines. In the 6-3 decision, the court's majority found that the administration did not possess the legal authority to impose a sweeping workplace vaccine mandate.

NUCA members who had over 100 employees were facing OSHA enforcement of this mandate beginning Feb. 10. NUCA had argued in our replies to OSHA that while we supported voluntary vaccines for employees, we did not support a government mandate requiring them. We believe these mandates were not needed to ensure a safe workplace in our industry. It is heartening to read that the highest court in the nation agreed with NUCA's arguments.

Employers are now released from their obligation to meet any part of OSHA's vaccine ETS, issued on Nov. 5, 2021. More here.

#### Infrastructure Caught Up In FY2022 Appropriations Fight

Congressional lawmakers are warning that implementation of last year's massive bipartisan infrastructure law could be held up if lawmakers don't reach an agreement on fiscal 2022 spending by Feb. 18, when the present continuing resolution will expire. Even programs paid for by the USDOT Highway Trust Fund will be affected. In many cases, if a new FY2022 bill is not signed into law the government may be forced to implement the new infrastructure law on a program-by-program basis, with some headed for smooth implementation and others held up until there is more funding certainty.

NUCA is working with senior House committee leadership to alert them that last year's big infrastructure win--and district projects--will be affected by this dispute if not resolved in February.

## SAFETY NEWS

#### **KINDNESS**

You might ask what kindness has to do with safety? It's a good question. So many times, doing what we do, we are faced with situations where we must make decisions that affect a person's life. There are people who just cannot work safely. They aren't "accident prone" but their work habits put themselves in a high-risk category. When that happens and corrective action plans are not effective, it becomes necessary to end the work relationship with that employee. When it becomes necessary to separate an employee, how that action takes place determines whether we maintain our efforts at education or not. Even when the employee has not performed well, the employee still needs to be told the reason for the separation. There is still a lesson to be learned. That lesson might provide an incentive for them to correct their behavior in their next vocation. We don't know if we don't try. Empathy is defined as the ability to understand other people's situations.

That doesn't mean being sympathetic to the point of excusing actions that could cause personal harm or the creation of a hazardous work environment for others. In those situations, accountability is necessary for a healthy work environment, but the way we do what we do reinforces our intent to support our cultural efforts and create a safer work environment for everyone. I am reminded by an incident many years ago when I lost focus and was stopped for speeding. The officer approached and asked me if I knew why I was being stopped. I said yes and he told me exactly how fast I was going. He wasn't judgmental or critical. He just stated fact and asked me if I was aware of the speed limit or if I had a reason for going that fast. I did know the speed limit and I did not have a reason for speeding. I was simply distracted. He was understanding and courteous and when he handed me my ticket, he told me to have a safe day and I thanked him. That was 25 years ago, and I haven't had a speeding ticket since.

Holding people accountable for their actions is something that makes a good company a great company because everyone understands the reasons behind the way we do what we do and the consequences of non-compliance. Accountability and kindness, that's also true of what makes a great country.


