## The Law and Your Business – Jacksonville Municipal Elections Tony Zebouni, Esq. NUCA NF General Counsel

It's important to know the issues and candidates in all local, state, and federal elections. Issues involving Public Procurement and JEA policies often require consideration and involvement by the Jacksonville City Council. There are 19 City Council Members (14 District and 5 At large). The General election date including but not limited to Mayor and City Council is March 21, 2023 (Early voting March 6-19). If no candidate receives 50%+1 majority then the run-off will be held on May 16, 2023 (early voting May 1-14).

Information regarding the candidates is available on-line, and we should all respect the commitment of citizens to run for elected office. Congressman John Rutherford is our guest speaker at the membership meeting on March 16, and I've invited Council Members Michael Boylan (District 6 and Ron Salem At-Large 2) and candidates Chris Miller (At Large 5) and Joe Carlucci (District 5) to attend as my guests based on our personal relationship and my belief in their commitment and consideration of transparent government and infrastructure. In short, I already enjoy an open and friendly line of communication with these candidates. It is important that you know the candidates and make your own informed decision on how to vote.

There are also issues of interest and concern in Tallahassee and we're working with Kari to prevent potentially unfavorable amendment to Ch 255.20 F.S.




#### **JACKSONVILLE ICEMEN HIGHLIGHTS**

#### **OSHA Announces Enforcement Guidance Changes**

OSHA announced that it has issued new enforcement guidance to make its penalties more effective towards employers who fail to comply with certain workplace safety and health regulations. OSHA administrators and directors now have the authority to cite cases with "high-gravity" serious violations of OSHA standards. These conditions include trenching, lockout/tagout, machine guarding, permit-required confined space, respiratory protection, falls, and for cases with other-than-serious violations specific to recordkeeping. The new guidance covers enforcement activity in construction and other industries, and becomes effective 60 days from Jan. 26, 2023. The current policy has been in place since 1990 and applies only to egregious willful citations.


## SAFETY NEWS

## How does a three-legged stool relate to safety?

There are dozens of analogies related to the three-legged stool illustration. The Engineering diagram here gives us an idea of what makes it work. Equal pressure on each leg to support the weight of the load above. That seems simple but there are factors that could create a problem in effectiveness. If any one of the dimensions of the legs change, balance is compromised. The principle is good. Build the stool following a plan that will insure a successfully balanced product. So, how does that relate to safety?

Any successful business must balance three main things to ensure success. Safety, Quality and Productivity in equal amounts. Safety comes first, followed by quality and then productivity. Without any one of those the likelihood of success is a matter of chance. If we believed that safety is a matter of chance and that things are going to happen anyway, it wouldn't be long until we would understand that not having safety first, is a matter of life and death. Think of a surgeon who performs bypass heart operations. Would you trust a surgeon that believes he's 90% effective? Would you fly on an airplane where the company says that they are 95% sure you won't crash? Granted, if we lived in a bubble and every chance of risk was completely removed, we would be entirely safe. However, we most likely would never be very productive since being productive involves an element of risk but, the level of prevention is equal to the level of importance. If productivity wasn't a factor, we soon would be out of money because there would not be a product to sell. If we didn't care about quality, no one would want our product and we would soon be out of business. So, if we are to expect to be able to successfully exist in the competitive world we live in, we must maintain a balance that ensures success. Safety Quality and Productivity, in equal amounts. Is the proper balance for business success.
