## The Law and Your Business – Public Records-Recovery of Attorney Fees Tony Zebouni, Lindell, Farson & Zebouni, P.A.

Many of you have bid and contracted, or intend to bid, with Public Entities in Florida. Often you may have a question or dispute and seek additional information. The Florida Public Records Law (Ch. 119) is a valuable mechanism to obtain reliable information from the government, absent filing a lawsuit. A recent appellate decision clarifies the requirements for recovery of attorney fees under Section 119, F.S.

Section 119.12(1)(b) requires a complainant to provide a separate "written notice identifying the public record request" before the plaintiff may recover attorney's fees in an enforcement action. In May 2019, the Plaintiff requested public records from the City related to a law enforcement matter. Plaintiff emailed this request to the City's Police Department and the City Clerk, who serves as the City's records custodian. After five months without response, Plaintiff filed suit to enforce his request. Only then did the City produce the requested public records. The City admitted that it wrongfully delayed delivery of the requested public records.

Section 119.12(1) -- titled "Attorney fees" -- provides in pertinent part:

(1) If a civil action is filed against an agency to enforce the provisions of this chapter, the court shall assess and award the reasonable costs of enforcement, including reasonable attorney fees, against the responsible agency if the court determines that:

(a) The agency unlawfully refused to permit a public record to be inspected or copied; and

(b) The complainant provided written notice identifying the public record request to the agency's custodian of public records at least 5 business days before filing the civil action, except as provided under subsection (2). The notice period begins on the day the written notice of the request is received by the custodian of public records, excluding Saturday, Sunday, and legal holidays, and runs until 5 business days have elapsed.

Unfortunately, the Plaintiff's sole communication with the city -- his emailed public record request itself – did not satisfy the requirements of section 119.12(1)(b)'s requirement that he provide "written notice identifying the public record request."

For purposes of determining eligibility for an award of attorney's fees, that public record request must satisfy section 119.12(1)(b)'s requirement that the complainant provide "written notice identifying the public record request," triggering the five-day notice period before a civil enforcement action could be filed. Plaintiff's failure to properly follow the requirements of the statute resulted in a failure to recover attorney fees. *Roldan v. City of Hallandale Beach*.

#### \$6 Billion In Drinking Water SRF Funding Released

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced April 4 it was releasing over \$6.5 billion for states for projects to upgrade drinking water infrastructure through the <u>Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF</u>). These new resources were made possible by the 2021 infrastructure law supported by NUCA. Almost \$3 billion of the funding announced will be provided specifically for lead service line identification and replacement, said EPA. However, about \$45 billion is estimated to be needed to replace all 9.2 million lead service lines in the U.S., an important point our members will be making to lawmakers at our May Washington Summit.

#### **Energy and Permitting Reform Bill Passes House**

The U.S. House passed on March 30 by a vote of 225-204 the "Lower Energy Costs Act" (H.R. 1), the GOP bill promoting domestic energy production. H.R. 1 will also institute comprehensive permitting reforms to speed the approval process used for infrastructure construction projects. According to the GOP, the proposed law will increase domestic energy production, reform the permitting process for all industries, reversing anti-energy policies advanced by the Biden Administration, streamline energy infrastructure and exports, and boost the production and processing of critical minerals. The bill's fate in the Senate remains uncertain.

## **Risk Management – What Is It?**

## **Risk Management Defined**

*Risk management* is the process of identifying, assessing, and controlling risks arising from operational factors and making decisions that balance risk costs with mission benefits.

If someone asks, "What do you do for a living?", we answer with the appropriate response but really, Risk Management is what we do every day. Risk Management is what our real job is. When we say "our job", that means all of us. Everything we do has an element of risk. Driving to work or the store, actually doing whatever our occupation is, even when we are doing something fun like boating, fishing, four wheeling, amusement parks, climbing mountains, yard work, honey-do projects, all contain an element of risk.
