The Law and Your Business

The Law and Your Business – Property Owner Liability Tony Zebouni, Esq. NUCA NF General Counsel

A recent reported case concerns a HVAC technician ("tech"), who was working on a roof in order to access the AC system when he fell through a skylight and sustained injuries that later resulted in his death. The accident occurred at a commercial warehouse in Miami and operated by a third party. The tech was an employee of an independent contractor, who was hired by the tenant leasing a unit in the warehouse.

There is a long-standing line of cases in construction law that provides the following rules regarding whether a property owner should be held liable for an independent contractor's employee's injuries:

Generally, "a property owner who employs an independent contractor to perform work on his/her property will not be held liable for injuries sustained by the employee of an independent contractor during the performance of that work. There are two exceptions to this rule. First, a property owner may be held liable for an independent contractor's employee's injuries if the owner actively participated in the work or exercised direct control over the work and failed to exercise that control with reasonable care. The second exception applies where the property owner fails to warn the contractor about concealed dangers not inherent in the work of which the owner had actual or constructive knowledge and which were unknown to the contractor or could not have been discovered through due care.

As the Owner of property, it is important to disclose any defects on the property to any contractor working on the project in order to avoid potential liability from claims by third parties. Any such disclosure should be in addition to maintaining liability insurance and requiring a contractor to obtain general liability insurance with the Owner as an additional primary insured. *Martex Corp. v. Artiles.*

Congress Opens Its 2023-24 Session

It's a new year, and a new Congress filled with opportunities for our industry's growth. The 117th Congress closed out with the industry's Water Resources Development Act being signed into law on Dec. 23, 2022. After the holiday break, the new 118th Congress was gaveled into existence at noon, Jan. 3, as per the Constitution's 20th Amendment. NUCA's advocacy plans for the new Congress include oversight of the new infrastructure law and ensuring states are receiving their allocations on time and in the right amount. We're starting the campaign in Congress to approve private activity bonds as another resource tapped to finance public infrastructure projects. NUCA will also be joining coalitions to address workforce development issues, including expanding programs like the H-2B visa and the proposed H-2C construction visa. NUCA's advocacy efforts this year can be your ticket to get involved in politics, starting with May 15-17 with the <u>2023 Washington Summit</u> held once again on Capitol Hill with your Chapter. Get involved in your association's state and national advocacy programs in '23!

Biden Administration Repealing WOTUS Regulatory Changes, Slows Infrastructure Programs

Numerous industry leaders issued statements after the Biden Administration formally proposed Dec. 29 reversing the Trump Administration's changes to the "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) rule, which will tighten the federal government's regulation of businesses, farmers, infrastructure builders, communities, and private citizens. The current Administration revives the previous regulation defining which wetlands and waterways are protected by the Clean Water Act. NUCA CEO Doug Carlson issued this statement in response: "Utility construction projects need predictability to make project deadlines and contain costs. The Biden Administration's repeal of the Trump Administration's clean-up of the WOTUS rules is going to add unnecessary confusion and delays to this industry's projects. Contractors will now be faced with more uncertainty when trying to comply with the new WOTUS rules, an outcome that will face even more confusion with a pending U.S. Supreme Court ruling on these regulations." Carlson joined new T&I Committee Chairman Sam Graves in <u>criticizing</u> the Administration proposal.

SAFETY NEWS

2023 Recordkeeping

Each new year we spend time reviewing the previous year to assess our progress and to plan and set goals for the new year. Along with that goal setting and planning are some things we need to take care of in our recordkeeping. There are some specific annual OSHA guidelines for that recordkeeping.

For any company with 10 or more employees the OSHA 300A Form should be posted in a conspicuous place at each jobsite from February 1 to April 30. In addition, the OSHA 300A Form must be electronically submitted to OSHA by March 2. Access to these forms is available through the OSHA website. It's a good idea to have someone on staff attend an OSHA Reporting class to learn the process and procedures involved in reporting and maintaining accurate data.

Along with the annual requirements for OSHA should be the review of handbooks and materials pertinent to safety and operating procedures of the company. OSHA requires an annual update of the safety manuals, and this also requires the input of hourly employees affected by the rules and regulations contained in the manuals.

An active and effective safety committee can be a valuable tool in the company safety program. The new year also provides an opportunity to rotate membership in the safety committee. Rotating membership annually provides for the input of more of the employee base and fresh insight into the safety process. Representatives should come from various areas of the operations because each operation has its own unique safety issues. Problem solving, setting policy, developing programs and safety implementation are the main functions of the safety committee as well as the communication and dissemination of materials and information to the company. Senior leadership participation is a must if the credibility of the safety program is to be a priority.

Getting a good start each new year is a fresh opportunity to review what worked and what didn't. It's a chance to fix what can be fixed and to improve on the culture of safety. If the safety program is working effectively, goals can, and will be, reached. Have a great 2023. Make it a great year.
