The Law and Your Business- New Law and NUCA Florida Legislative

One of the important benefits (in addition to safety and education training) of being a member of NUCA is the opportunity to participate in or observe the legislative process. NUCA Legislative Days will be held in Tallahassee, on January 27-28, 2026. Contact Jennifer or Kari if you're interested in attending.

In the past session of the legislature several bills were passed, and one could have importance to your workers in the field. Should any of your employees be confronted with aggressive or violent behavior while working on site, they are additional consequences to the aggressor. I have included a copy of Ch. 784.07, F.S. for your consideration.

784.07 Assault or battery of law enforcement officers and other specified personnel; reclassification of offenses; minimum sentences.— (1) As used in this section, the term: (h) "Utility worker" means a person who bears at least one patch, emblem, organizational identification, or other clear marking that is intended to be plainly visible, that identifies the employing or contracting utility, and that clearly identifies the person as a utility worker under contract with or employed by an entity that owns, operates, leases, or controls a plant, property, or facility for the generation, transmission, distribution, or furnishing to or for the public, of electricity, natural or manufactured gas or propane, water, wastewater, telephone, or communications service, including two or more utilities rendering joint service.

Industry News and Advocacy

U.S. Government In Partial Shutdown

The House and Senate were unable to resolve their differences over the FY2026 appropriations process and sent the federal government into a partial shutdown on Oct. 1. A funding stoppage will stop construction activity on certain jobsites immediately, with federally-funded projects the first to be affected. A shutdown could keep contracting officers and support staff away from their jobs unable to offer approval for project phases. Fixed-price contracts with appropriated federal resources probably can continue paid work, but state and local construction tied to federal resources could face obstacles.

Most highway programs will operate without interruption because they receive funding from the Highway Trust Fund and the NUCA-supported 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act rather than annual federal appropriations. State revolving funds (SRF) can continue lending with existing grants and loan repayments, but new federal grants and some approvals may be paused. EPA may stop issuing permits, conducting enforcement inspections, and approving new grants.

The House passed a GOP-led funding extension Sept. 19 primarily along party lines. It was a "clean" continuing resolution (CR) because it extended until Nov. 21 current spending levels without adding unrelated policy changes. However, that bill has yet to be passed by the Senate, encountering Democrat opposition who seek in return for their votes an extension of health care insurance subsidies.

NUCA is urging both Congress, President Trump, and the leadership in both parties to find a compromise that will keep the nation's infrastructure projects moving forward over the weeks and months ahead. We build our nation's foundation for future economic growth and national success, and depend on federal resources to deliver these projects to all American communities.

New NUCA National Leadership Structure

NUCA announced on Oct. 8 a positive step forward in NUCA's leadership structure. Effective immediately, Chris Barrett has been named Chief Staff Officer (CSO), and beginning October 16, Zack Perconti will join the organization as the Chief Advocacy Officer (CAO).

This dual-leadership model provides NUCA with both operational continuity and external momentum. It clearly defines the Chief Staff Officer's responsibility for internal management and governance, while positioning the Chief Advocacy Officer to focus on advocacy through member engagement and industry influence.

Over the last six years, Perconti has led NUCA's advocacy and lobbying efforts with distinction, building valuable connections for our members and industry. Now as CAO, his leadership will accelerate those efforts, ensuring NUCA's voice continues to be heard at the highest levels.

With Chris Barrett's nine-year tenure at NUCA, her deep background in association management, and more than 25 years of executive leadership experience, NUCA will benefit from her steady, proven leadership. Her role ensures organizational stability, effective Board and Governance support, and sound financial oversight. Together, Barrett and Perconti form a balanced, complementary leadership team—one that embodies NUCA's purpose and positions this association for both continuity and long-term growth.

PIPES ACT Passes House T&I Committee

The House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee on Sept. 17 passed by voice vote the PIPES Act (H.R. 5301), sending it to the full House for consideration. The bipartisan bill reauthorizes the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration's (PHMSA's) pipeline safety programs for the next four years, and provides an efficient framework to advance the safety of U.S. energy infrastructure.

NUCA wrote in its letter of support: "Strengthening damage prevention laws is critical to reducing these incidents, protecting lives, and safeguarding infrastructure. H.R. 5301 enhances excavation safety, strengthens existing pipeline infrastructure, and supports the construction of modernized energy distribution systems to meet growing national demands. By mandating robust state-level policies—such as improved utility locating, mandatory 811 call systems, and stricter enforcement—the bill addresses systemic gaps that lead to preventable accidents."

SAFETY NEWS

Hand Arm Vibration

Sustained on the job, vibration during some tool use can lead to lasting health problems. Tools like grinders, chop saws, jack hammers, drills, and chain saws create vibrations that can affect the nerves in hands and arms that can lead to permanent nerve damage. Symptoms of vibration induced muscular skeletal disorders include numbness or pain and discoloration of the fingers as well as weakened grip from nerve and blood vessel damage. A hallmark disorder of vibration is Raynaud's syndrome or "white finger" which is an irreversible condition when repeated vibration exposure causes the blood vessels to collapse. The good news is that there are steps that can be taken to reduce the risk of damage from vibration exposure. Recommendations include keeping machines and tools in proper working order, alternate between vibrating and non-vibrating tools, taking breaks, from the vibrating tools, and educating workers on the hazards and safe use of vibrating tools. Proper PPE like work gloves will dampen the effects of vibration. Keeping the workers hands dry and warm and using good hand position will also help in the prevention process. We use many of these tools almost daily. Occasional use is usually not considered to be a significant hazard, but precautions still must be taken. With sustained use, the hazard must be recognized and addressed. So, many of the things we do have risks attached but with proper training, PPE, and awareness, we can reduce the risk factor significantly.

Why is a Return to Work Program Light Duty Important?

1. Promotes Employee Recovery and Retention

- Injuries can happen on the job, especially in physically demanding environments. A light duty program allows
 employees who have been injured to return to work in a capacity that doesn't aggravate their injury but keeps
 them engaged. This helps them stay connected to the company while they recover, rather than being sidelined
 for an extended period.
- Retaining injured employees is often more cost-effective than hiring and training new ones.

2. Reduces Costs and Liability

- If an injured worker stays out of work for a long time, there are costs associated with workers' compensation, as
 well as potential increases in insurance premiums. The program can help minimize these costs by getting
 workers back on the job sooner, even if it's in a modified or lighter role.
- By providing light duty options, the company is also showing that they are actively working to accommodate injured workers, which can reduce the risk of litigation and legal claims.

3. Maintains Workforce Productivity

If a worker can return to a less physically demanding role (such as administrative work, training, or equipment
inspection) during their recovery, it helps the company maintain productivity and keeps the worker from
becoming disengaged or feeling disconnected from the team. This continuity also prevents major delays in
projects, which is important in utility contracting where timing and deadlines are often crucial.

4. Improves Morale and Company Culture

- When workers see that the company is committed to their health and well-being (by offering light duty or
 modified roles), it helps build a sense of trust and loyalty. This can lead to higher morale across the workforce,
 as employees feel supported in times of need.
- It reinforces a culture of care and responsibility, where the company values the health and rehabilitation of its employees, which can be especially important in industries with physically demanding jobs.

5. Legal and Safety Benefits

Having a structured light duty program ensures that the company is following best practices and industry
standards for workplace safety and injury management. This can be critical if an inspection or audit occurs and
shows that the company is not only providing accommodations but also actively working to keep its workers
safe and healthy

Conclusion: a return to work light duty program serves both the worker and the business by helping injured employees recover without losing their productivity or connection with the company while also protecting the business from unnecessary cost or liability.
